Allocation Methods of Fund Manager

Proportional by Balance

This allocation method is the calculating proportion of the master trade volume according to the balances of the investor's accounts.

The fraction of the master trade volume is calculated automatically.

500 Investor B Lot Opened: 0.4 lot **Investor A** Master Lot Opened: 0.3 lot Lot Opened: 1 Lot 500 Lot Opened Investor C

Lot Opened: 0.3 lot

Master's Balance: 1600

Example:

Lot Opened on Investor A's Account : $\frac{500}{1600} \times 1 = 0.3$ Lot (Buy/Sell)

Formula: $\frac{Investor's\ Account\ Balance}{Master's\ Balance} \times \frac{Lot\ Opened}{by\ Master}$

Allocation Methods of Fund Manager

Proportional By Equity

This allocation method is similar to the Proportional by Balance in a way that proportion is calculated automatically. The difference is that Equity is used instead of Balance.

The fraction of the master trade volume is calculated automatically.

500 Investor B Lot Opened: 0.4 lot **Investor A** Master Lot Opened: 0.3 lot Lot Opened: 1 Lot 500 Investor C

Lot Opened: 0.3 lot

Master's Equity: 1600

Example:

Lot Opened on Investor A's Account : $\frac{500}{1600} \times 1 = 0.3$ Lot (Buy/Sell)

Formula: $\frac{Investor's\ Account\ Equity}{Master's\ Equity} \times \frac{Lot\ Opened\ by\ Master}$



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
